We provide this list of materials as a guide only for you to bring to the Retreat. Your Tutor has compiled this list so you can embrace the class and skills being taught.

Please bring the following

- **1 x Upholstered furniture piece**
 - Suitability of the furniture piece must be discussed with Lasse and Helena prior to registration.
 - Examples of a suitable piece - timber framed chair with upholstered seat and back
 - dining chair, occasional chair or armchair
- **Tools:**
 - hammer, staple lifter, webbing stretcher, mallet, scissors, tape measure.
 - We can either sell these to the student or assist the student with purchasing these
- PPE: paper dust mask with valve, disposable rubber gloves
- Camera
- Notebook and pencil for notetaking
- Appropriate upholstery materials for their furniture item
 - these will be discussed with each student prior to registration.

Approximate material cost –

- \$50-\$150 plus fabric is the estimated material cost
 - cost of materials will depend on the furniture item
 - the tutor will provide estimate of costs to each student upon enrolment, and after discussion with student about their selected furniture piece
- Please note you may already have some items in your art wares collection. Sometimes a tutor or the McGregor Retreats may be able to buy items in bulk to get the best price and we would then seek reimbursement from you. This will be communicated if required.
